Drones

Foundations of Flight

This course is an overview of professional drone operations. Topics covered in this course include operating systems on different consumer and commercial aircraft, introduction to standard operating procedures for conducting drone flights, and drone mapping/modeling. You will be introduced to the information in the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 14 Part 107 Remote Pilot Certificate with a small Unmanned Aircraft Systems (sUAS). This course will prepare you to take the Airman Knowledge test to become a commercial drone operator.

Certified Hemodialysis | Technician

This program is designed for those working in or desiring employment as a hemodialysis technician in the healthcare field. Students will study the basic requirements for patient care, renal anatomy and physiology, treatment procedures and processes, water treatment, dialyzer reprocessing, ethics and laws governing medical care, and the effect of nutrition and medication on the patient. Students will also be exposed to the equipment and environment used for renal dialysis. Students must have a high school diploma or equivalent. Upon completion of the program, students can sit for the Certified Clinical Hemodialysis Technician (CCHT) exam through the Nephrology Nursing Certification Commission (NNCC). This program includes 200 hours of classroom lecture and a potential clinical internship opportunity at a local healthcare provider. Students must qualify for an internship. Tuition includes textbooks, scrubs, background check, drug screen, certification exam, supplies, and internship/clinical lab experience. Prerequisite: CNA certification or experience preferred.

Emergency Medical Technician – Basic Certification Course



The EMT-Basic Certification Course represents the first response of the emergency medical system. Be prepared to care for patients at the scene of an accident and transport them by ambulance to the hospital directed by more highly trained medical personnel. Learn basic emergency skills to assess a patient's condition and manage respiratory, cardiac, and trauma emergencies. This course combines 100 hours of online training, and 80 hours of classroom instruction that includes hands-on learning. Participants must schedule an ambulance ride-along outside of regular class hours. This course is approved by the State of Delaware Office of Emergency Medical Services and the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians. Prerequisite: Attendance at an information session. Internship/ clinical experience included (hours may vary from course schedule). Class will be held in Dover on the weekends.

Polysomnography (Sleep) Technician

Sleep technologists assist in the clinical assessment, testing, diagnosis, management, and prevention of sleep-related disorders. Sleep Technologist are allied health professionals who may work in sleep disorder centers, sleep specialty clinics, Durable Medical Equipment (DME) settings and corporate, academic and research settings. Delaware Tech's Sleep Technician program is accredited by The American Academy of Sleep Medicine's (AASM) Accredited Sleep Technologist Education Program (A-STEP). This course plus the included Exam and Online Self-Study Modules meets "Pathway 3" eligibility criteria to sit for the Certified Polysomnographic Technician (CPSGT) exam administered by the Board of Registered Polysomnographic Technologists (BRPT). The CPSGT credential qualifies the student to apply for the Delaware Polysomnography License (other states may vary). Tuition includes the 80-Hour Introductory Course, Exam fee, Online Self-Study Modules, CPR certification, textbooks, and all required supplies.



This program includes 420 hours of classroom lecture and labs and clinical internship opportunities at local healthcare providers. Students must qualify for an internship. Our Mission

The Workforce Development and Community Education division of the College provides lifelong learning opportunities for personal and professional growth for a diverse population through quality education and training programs. In addition, the division supports economic development efforts by designing and delivering training programs that address the specific needs of local businesses and industries.

Cancellation of Classes

Classes will be canceled if a minimum number of full-paying students have not registered.

Enrollment Policy

You are enrolled upon receipt of payment, provided there is space in the class. You will be contacted if there is a problem.

Refund Policy

For a full refund, you must contact the Workforce Development and Community Education office at least 72 hours before the first session. Withdrawals within the first week receive a 75% refund. Refunds are not given for classes that have three or fewer sessions, with the exception of the above 72-hour refund request. Please note that there are some courses with different refund policies.

Continuing Education Units (CEUs) Awards

The CEU (Continuing Education Unit) is a nationally accepted standard for non-credit continuing education courses. A certificate is awarded upon successful completion and may be used as a reference for job promotion or hiring. Designated non-credit professional development courses are CEU-certified.

Tax Deduction/Credit Policy

An income tax deduction/credit may be permitted for educational expenses incurred while maintaining and improving professional skills. Consult your tax specialist for more information.

FERPA

FERPA was enacted to protect the privacy of educational records and to provide guidelines for the correction of inaccurate or misleading data through informal and formal hearings. Among other things, FERPA gives students the right to file complaints with the United States Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the educational institution to comply with the Act.

Nondiscrimination Policy

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The newly expanded SEED (Student Excellence Equals Degree) Scholarship Program is now open to Delawareans of all ages who would like to pursue an academic degree or workforce training credential. This is an excellent opportunity for state residents who want to change careers or re-enter the workforce, but first need to obtain critical workforce training in less time than it would take to earn an academic degree.

The expanded SEED scholarship includes short-term certificate programs. Workforce training certificates do not require a minimum GPA, but do require graduation from a Delaware high school/GED program.
